TYPES OF WORDS

A GUIDE FOR WORD-MAKERS

ADJECTIVE: a word that describes something else

Examples: brave, clumsy, loud, orange, goofy, clever, spicy, gigantic

NOUN: a person, place, or thing

Examples: wombat, doorbell, sock, pirate, trampoline, toilet, superhero

PLURAL NOUN: a noun that refers to more than one person, place, or thing

Examples: squirrels, monsters, popsicles, asteroids, pajamas, babies

PROPER NOUN: a name used for a specific person, place, or organization

Examples: Giannis Antetokounmpo, Taylor Swift, Australia, Jupiter, the Milwaukee Brewers

VERB: an action word

Examples: drool, sob, chuckle, flip, breakdance, bellow, scoot, dive
