Listed on the National Register of Historic Buildings, and an official Milwaukee landmark, Central Library is an architectural jewel which showcases detailed craftsmanship, ornate decoration, and fascinating special features.

Milwaukee Public Library is looking for volunteers who enjoy teaching or talking in front of a group, have experience in doing so, and who would like to share their love of libraries, books and buildings. Docents lead architectural tours of the Central Library, answer questions, and share information about library amenities and the Friends of the Milwaukee Public Library.

As part of the Docent Enrichment Program, volunteer docents meet eight to ten times per year to learn about the Milwaukee Public Library's history and architecture, projects and services. As a group, they take field trips and guided tours at other libraries and cultural institutions to enhance general knowledge, and to gain tips and tricks from peer docents.
