
Dr. Mona Hanna-Attisha's book, *What The Eyes Don't See: A Story of Crisis, Resistance and Hope in an American City*, details her experience uncovering the lead-poisoning epidemic caused by a switch in Flint's water supply. *The New York Times* has named *What The Eyes Don't See* as one of the 100 Most Notable Books of 2018.

In this powerful talk, Dr. Mona will share her personal account of her research and activism to expose and mitigate the effects of the Flint water crisis. Her dramatic story, from how she used science to prove that Flint children were affected by lead to the brutal backlash she faced after courageously going public with her findings, inspires audiences to safeguard their own communities by speaking truth to power.
